




THE PICTURES (AND WORDS!) IN YOUR MIND

JOSLYNN CORTES (Ms. Penny/Mom/Artist/Others)

Hola I'm Joslynn and I am a Los Angeles based actor, singer and vocal teacher! I've been singing in front of people since I was 4 years old. After going on a field trip to see *Tarzan* on Broadway, I made the decision I was going to perform for a living. That's quite a big decision to make at 12 years old, but when you know, you know. In high school, I studied at the Apple Farms Theatre

Academy in New Jersey and then studied at the American Musical and Dramatic Academy Conservatory in New York City and earned my BFA at AMDA Los Angeles. Before I made my move across the country to Los Angeles, I was afforded the opportunity to play some iconic roles of characters I grew up being obsessed with, like Junie B. Jones in Junie B. Jones the Musical and Arlene (Garfield's girlfriend) in *Garfield the Musical with Cattitude*. I also had so much fun on tour playing a Superhero Dog named Fiber in *Nick Nutrition and His Wonder Dog Fiber*! I absolutely love what I do and I know that my success would not exist if it weren't for the constant support, love, wisdom and constructive criticism gifted to me by my family and my teachers all throughout my elementary, middle and high school years. My advice to you would be: Pursue your dreams wholeheartedly. It's not going to be easy and sometimes you will want to quit, but if you are really passionate about it, go for it. Don't let anyone bully you out of it, or make you feel like your dreams are impossible. That passion and spark was given to you for a reason.

I graduated from St. Olaf College, majoring in Pre-Medicine, Psychology, and Statistics, but discovered my true calling was to be an artist after performing in the musical, *Bat Boy*. Whether as an actor, writer, director, or producer,

the arts allow me to use all of my skills and education to bring people together through storytelling. As a musical theatre performer, you may have seen me in You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown, and Little Shop of Horrors, right here at South Coast Repertory, or The Sound of Music with Musical Theatre West. As a voiceover artist, I have voiced characters for "Pokémon" and "Yu-Gi-Oh!" and narrated the YA Audiobook, Winston Chu versus the Whimsies by Stacey Lee. My advice: keep dreaming, and dream BIG!

My parents saw how much I loved to perform, so they put me in ballet lessons. Fast forward many years and classes later, I studied Musical Theatre at UC Irvine. As much as I enjoy telling serious and dramatic stories, I LOVE making

people laugh. I also love teaching young artists, lifting weights and making jewelry. Whoever is reading this right now: Keep being your wonderful and multipassionate self! It is your greatest superpower.



BRADLEY SHARPER (*Rover/Jeff/Others*)

I grew up in Southern Maryland, where I spent my childhood singing, acting, and dreaming of big adventures. After high school, I followed my dreams to The American Musical and Dramatic Academy in New York City, where I studied acting, singing and performing. Later, I moved to sunny Santa Monica and taught acting classes to amazing kids like you—it was so

much fun! I've always loved music, too. I started playing guitar when I was eight years old, and now I play in a rock band called Sharper's Florist. Back in New York, I played folk music at bars and cafes all over Manhattan, fueled by Chipotle burritos and Red Bulls (don't recommend). Now, as a Los Angeles-based actor, you might see me in commercials or hear my voice in video games and cartoons. I love bringing stories to life and inspiring others to follow their creative dreams!

ARTIST BIOS

MADHURI SHEKAR (Playwright). My name is Madhuri Shekar, and I wrote the "book" for The Incredible Book Eating Boy. The "book" of a musical is basically the story of the show, and all the dialogue that the characters speak. Everything that happens on stage that isn't technically a song? That's the stuff I helped to create and write! I've always loved writing. When I was a kid, I wrote a lot of poems, silly songs, and Harry Potter fanfiction. In college, I fell in love with theatre. I wrote and produced plays with my friends, and wanted to keep doing it forever. So I decided to study playwriting for real. I got my MFA in Dramatic Writing at USC, not too far from here. Nothing makes me happier than writing for young people. I really hope you enjoy the show! And if you don't, well, go home and write something better, I dare you. (I'm kidding, but also, I'm not.) I hope you make stuff and keep making stuff your whole life. We need your art and creativity in the world.

CHRISTIAN MAGBY (Music) is an actor and composer, who previously starred in the world premiere of the rock musical, Galileo at Berkeley Repertory Theatre. He had a supporting role in the Oscar-nominated, Amazon feature, One Night in Miami, and was a recurring guest star for two seasons on The CW's series, "The Flash," and he also recurred on The CW series, "Legacies." Born in Atlanta, Magby started his acting career with the Youth Ensemble of Atlanta. At 16, he wrote his first musical, Love DOES Cost a Thing, which premiered at 7 Stages Theatre. Since then, he composed the music for The Incredible Book Eating Boy, which ran at Alliance Theatre Company. He composed the music for Milo Imagines the World, which premiered at Chicago Children's Theatre. In addition, Magby executive produced and composed the musical Mother of God, which premiered at the Southwest Arts Center in Atlanta. Magby has worked as an actor and music director in a number of Atlanta theatres, including Alliance Theatre, Aurora Theatre, Horizon Theatre Company, Theatrical Outfit, and Kenny Leon's True Colors Theatre Company. He is a graduate of SCAD and was commissioned to arrange the school's alma mater.

CHRISTIAN ALBRIGHT (Lyrics) is a playwright, songwriter and voice actor in Atlanta. He wrote the lyrics for Milo Imagines the World, which recently premiered at the Chicago Children's Theatre, and will make its second premiere at Children's Theatre Company in Minneapolis. Albright was born in New York and moved to Atlanta, GA in his late teens where he became a performer for the Youth Ensemble of Atlanta (YEA). There, he developed his performance skills and would eventually write skits and teach the newly inducted youth in the program. Albright briefly studied theatre at Oglethorpe University, where he did perform in the university plays & musicals. He went on to perform in Georgia Shakespeare's production of Macbeth. Albright soon fostered connections with the Alliance Theatre, eventually becoming the lyricist for their musical adaptation of The Incredible Book Eating Boy and soon after, becoming a collaborative songwriter for their musical adaptation of the story of Peter Rabbit, Into the Burrow.

H. ADAM HARRIS (Director) My name is H. Adam Harris, but everyone calls me H! I'm an actor, teacher, and the director of this production of The Incredible Book Eating Boy. I got into theatre because I had an incredible high school theatre teacher (who won a Tony Award for teaching!) who inspired me. When I graduated from college, I acted on stages, narrated family concerts with orchestras and led story time with local libraries. As a director, I believe in telling heart-first stories that center possibility, tenderness and grit. All things you'll see in this production. ZACHARY DIETZ (Music Director)

Hello! I am a music director, conductor, and keyboardist who helps bring musicals to life! I've worked on big Broadway shows like Mrs. Doubtfire, School of Rock, In the Heights, Wicked, and The Lion King. I teach music at UC Irvine, where I help students learn how to lead and direct music for theatre. I love working with kids and young performers! I'm currently adapting a new children's musical based on the Catstronauts! graphic novels.

FRED KINNEY (Scenic Designer) | build the models and create the drawings that the carpenters and the painters use to build the scenery that you see on stage. This is my 13th production at SCR. For past shows, I designed various locations such as the dark forest for Snow White, the neighborhood for Last Stop on Market Street, and interiors and exteriors that Nate the Great traveled to in order to unravel the mystery. For A Year with Frog and Toad, a marsh, the scaffold playground that lit up for Pinocchio, the woods for Robin Hood and the elephant for The Emperor's New Clothes. When I was a small boy, I thought I might become a painter, sculptor or an architect. But in high school, I started to design the scenery for our school productions and really enjoyed it-and I still do. I'm the proud father of Gigi and Kate, who will be seeing The Incredible Book Eating Boy.

ADRIANA LAMBARRI (Costume De**signer)** When I was a kid, my interests were design, drawing, and all things theatre-related. I also enjoyed playing dress-up and took Halloween very seriously. (I still do!) I went to art school in San Francisco and learned all about design and how to build clothes, which later helped me when I began to pursue costume design. As luck would have it, I had an actor friend ask me if I could help him with the costume designs of a film he was working on, which I did and LOVED. I haven't stopped designing since! Now I get to tell stories with other designers through clothing. My very first professional theater gig was sewing in the costume shop here at SCR, but my favorite gig is building my son Bramwell's Halloween costume every year. I hope you enjoy the show as much as I enjoyed designing it!

AVERY REAGAN (Lighting Designer)

I am an Orange County-based Lighting Designer. I received my BS from the University of Evansville in Indiana, and I received my MFA from UC Irvine. Once upon a time, I thought I was going to be an actor. I spent so many years acting and singing in plays and choirs, but then I started helping with other jobs in the theatre and fell in love with lighting. I always loved math while in school, and lighting design allows me to combine my math brain with my art brain. Now that I'm a full-time designer, I travel all over the world turning lights on and off for a living. You might have seen some of my work at SCR with the Theatre Conservatory Summer Players productions of Matilda or Seussical!

ERIC BACKUS (Sound Designer) I work in Southern California and Chicago as a composer and sound designer. I am currently a graduate student at UC Irvine. I started playing music when I was in fourth grade, and developed an interest in theatre tech when I was in high school. After I graduated college, I moved to Chicago where I began to write music and sound design for theatre. Since then, I've worked on productions all over the country, including Off-Broadway. Many of the shows I've worked on have been adaptations of books like Bunnicula, Peter Pan, Pride and Prejudice, War and Peace, A Wrinkle in Time, The Secret Garden, The Hobbit, Cinderella and Sherlock Holmes. ANNIE YEE (Choreography) I am a Los Angeles based choreographer. I love dance and have been dancing my whole life. I started at age 5 and took ballet, tap, jazz and hula. My Mom wanted me to see which style of dance I liked best, and it was all of them! She said I should learn all kinds of dance and the music of each kind because it tells you what the dances are about. I love theatre too! My Mom took me to my first musical when I

was nine, that's when I knew I wanted to dance on stage. My Dad took me to Chinese Opera, which has dance, martial arts and singing, it taught me about my culture. My parents, Tommy and Nancy Yee, are my heroes and inspiration. They taught me to be happy and brave. I love them so much. As a grown-up, I studied dance with Alvin Ailey in New York.

NATALIE FIGAREDO (Stage Manag-

er) I started stage managing many years ago in a school called California State University, Long Beach, where I worked on musicals, plays and Shakespeare! Then I went to school in London, England where I learned how to build sets, focus lights and production manage. Plus, I got to see cool shows like Matilda and Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. I also used to work at Disneyland with Mickey, Minnie, Donald and Goofy! But my favorite thing to do is work on the Theatre for Young Audiences and Families plays here at SCR! I've worked on Snow White, Amos and Boris, Tales of a 4th Grade Nothing, Junie B. Jones is Not a Crook!, Mr. Popper's Penguins, A Year With Frog and Toad, The Night Fairy and Robin Hood. Also my favorite food is mac and cheese!

KYRSTEN GOODRICH (Assistant

Stage Manager) (she/ her) I fell in love with live performance in high school, singing in all three of the choirs, and then finally auditioning for the spring musical. As fun as it was to sing and dance on stage, I found it to be much more fulfilling to be backstage and help make the show run as smoothly as possible. So I traded my character shoes for a headset and I now have a theatre degree from CSU Chico and a Masters degree in Stage Management from UC Irvine. I have enjoyed travelling the country in order to work on all kinds of shows for all kinds of audiences, and my favorite are the shows that make me laugh!
